



Data Tip: Race and Ethnicity Reporting

Within the CRDC, all LEAs must report students using the seven racial/ethnic categories found in the U.S. Department of Education's Final Guidance on Collecting, Maintaining and Reporting Data on Race and Ethnicity. The Final Guidance outlines a procedure for **collecting** racial and ethnic data and a procedure for **reporting** racial and ethnic data.

Collecting by the Seven Race and Ethnicity Categories

To collect the data, the agency must ask a two part question:

- 1) Are you Hispanic/Latino (Yes/No)

- 2) Select one or more races from the following five racial groups:
 - a) American Indian or Alaska Native
 - b) Asian
 - c) Black or African American
 - d) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
 - e) White

Reporting the Seven Race and Ethnicity Categories

Once the data are collected, the data are tabulated and reported as follows.

There are 7 reporting categories:

- 1) Hispanic/Latino of any race

And for individuals who are non-Hispanic/Latino:

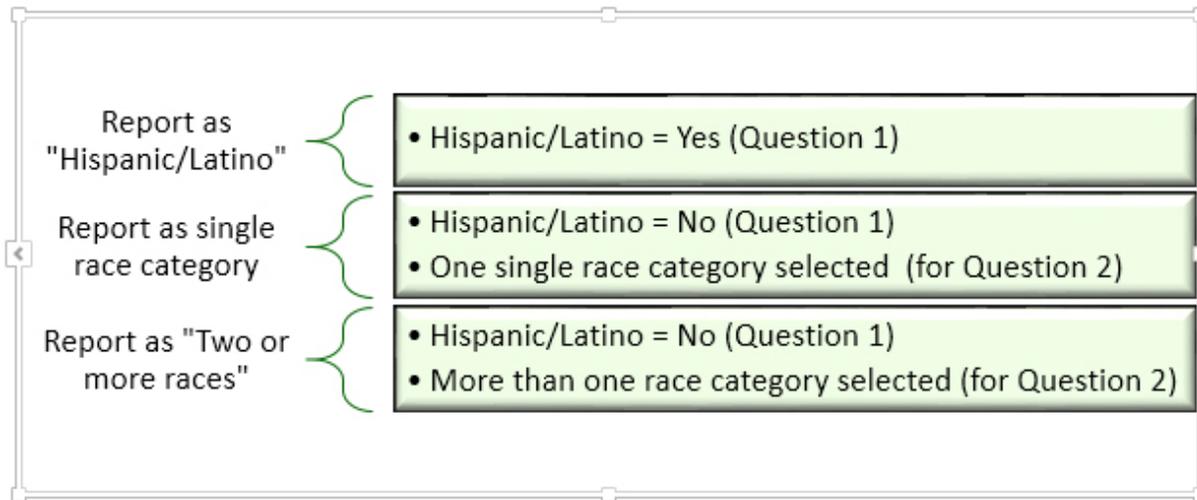
- 2) American Indian or Alaska Native
- 3) Asian
- 4) Black or African American
- 5) Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
- 6) White
- 7) Two or more races

Note: *These procedures do not include an option for a student to select a box labeled "Two or more races." Collections that employ such a method do not comply with the Final Guidance.*

Note: *Some states may breakdown these categories into more granular categories for state reporting needs, but for CRDC purposes, they must be rolled up into these categories.*



How to Determine the Reporting Category:



If a student answered the first question "Yes" then that student is tabulated as Hispanic, even if the student selected one or more categories in response to the second question.

If a student answered the first question "No" and selected a single category for the second question, then that student is tabulated as the selected category from the second question.

If a student answered the first question "No" and selected more than one category for the second question, then that student is tabulated as "Two or more races."

What if Race/Ethnicity Data are not Provided?

For CRDC Reporting:

For CRDC purposes, do not report students whose race is unknown or undeclared. The CRDC calculates totals based on the sum of racial/ethnic categories, so you will get an error if you, for example, report a student as limited English proficient without including the student in the counts by gender and race/ethnicity.
